MESSAGE FROM REVD PHILIP SMITH...

It's always a delight to meet on a Sunday whenever we are able and it's never the same without you. But there are many reasons why we are not all able to join together and so we know deep down that church is never just about this gathering, or a building.

I am often asked how many are in your church and I would always say about 17,000, they just don't all come at the same time. Similarly, I would be asked where my church was and I would say, well some are at home, at school, at work, some shopping, some out playing and some asleep. The simple concept of 'whole life worship' is the simple understanding that our lives are a worship to God wherever we are, whatever we are doing, for though it may be good to come to church. It's much better to be church, for church is who we are, not where or when we go or log on.

Here at St Nicholas' Church, we can engage with our local community and our wandering community, walkers etc. in many ways. One of these is massive for we are blessed with a wonderful Church school. Never let it be said that no children come to us on a Sunday, for we go to them Mondays to Fridays.

It has been a delight to share with Mark our Rector going into Ibstone School to take the Collective Act of Worship on Thursday mornings at 9:00 am and we take alternative weeks. It is also a delight for me to share this with Lucy. The children have got to know us. We play on the fact that Mark and I are delightfully different, so that the children can also be who they are. Some love to answer all the questions and do the action songs whilst others may be more reserved, and that's ok too.

Recently we met a newcomer to the Reception Class who has the most amazing gift of the gab. Lucy and I were invited to join the Family Walk before half-term, which has been the first since before Lockdown. Here we met this child's parents and were able to walk and talk. The children were walking in their Family Groups that go across the ages giving the older children responsibilities. Here in informal ways bonds are built. The walk finished at the church where the children who wanted to pray out loud, growing in confidence each time.

Lucy and I have also been able to introduce the school to Fischy Music, a Scottish based group that have an amazing repertoire of songs that build emotional intelligence. The children love these songs instantly and at the last assembly our newest recruit put their hand up and said, "can we sing that again please?".

There were 71 in church for our Harvest Service, another opportunity to show that church, school, and community are one.

All of these activities may never put the proverbial 'bums on seats', but we are all in God's business as Jesus called it of building a kingdom and not filling in a census statistics form.



COMMUNITY MATTERS FOOD BANK

Based at Lane End, this is not just a food bank, as they also offer pastoral care and have a small fund where we can help those that really need it to buy essential things like a new washing machine or cooker, help with school uniform or children going on a school trip. We also help with getting to hospital appointments and help some of the families who are really struggling. Currently the programme supports 20 families that regularly receive help each week.

Food Items:

- Pasta sauces
- Tinned tomatoes
- Baked Beans
- Tinned hot dogs
- Tinned meatballs in tomato sa
- Coffee/tea
- Squash – any flavour
- Tins/cartons of custard
- Microwaveable rice
- Jams/marmalade
- Peanut butter

Household Items:

- Laundry powder/capsules
- Washing up liquid
- Shower Gel
- Toilet rolls
- Kitchen rolls
- Shampoo/conditioner
- Fabric conditioner
- Cleaning products
- Toothpaste

Sadly, in the light of the current restrictions, we cannot accept fresh produce. At present we do not need any pasta or cereals, but we are particularly in need of the household items. Any support you can give is much appreciated.

Ibstone's collection box is outside Blue Hills, the home of Jenny and David Davis. This is the second house on the left when you enter the village travelling from the Stokenchurch direction.
