Family Time

We had some special visitors joining us for Family Time today, one of our governors came into school to see Collective Worship in action, they spent time with all the children in Family Time and spoke to staff and children before being part of our Friday Worship. We also welcomed Rev Charlie Kerr to the Ibstone Family for the afternoon, Rev Charlie wrote Space Makers. He enjoyed being part of Family Time and was very impressed by our older children and how they led Family Time.

Today's focus was Mending, the children made a web with wool to show the strength of community and talked about how this web can make us feel safe and loved. They also talked about how the 'web' can be mended if it gets broken. This led on to the children focussing on forgiveness. The whole school community each had an acorn to hold, they had to think about an experience where they needed to forgive someone, the children held onto the acorn tightly and made the decision to let it go and forgive the person, in forgiving them they would place the acorn on the ground and allow new life to grow and flourish. The children also knew that they could decide that they were not yet ready to forgive and they could put the acorn back and give themsleves more time to think about forgiveness. The children who put their acorns back could talk to an adult about the situation if they wanted to. The whole school thought that the mending acorns might be a really good way to resolve playtime issues and that mending was a good exercise for them to understand and learn the feeling within themselves.
