Dear Families,

Monday was World Kindness Day, this turned into Kindness Week here at Ibstone and the whole school community have been working on building each other up following our Golden Rule of being kind. Over the course of the week we have thought about how our words and actions can hurt others, how that could impact how we feel about ourselves and how that can impact our self esteem and our ability to learn. The whole school community know that there are many people in our school they can speak to if they have any worries or concerns. Weekly Round Up

Ladybirds

This week Ladybirds have worked really hard to retell and write their own story based on The Little Red Hen; they have used their phonics and our tricky words to help them. They have written a bit more of the story each day. We have also played rhyming games. Our phonic sounds this week have been qu, z zz and ch and the tricky words learnt to, go, no, into. In mathematics, we focussed on the numbers 4 and 5 and the children have been learning to subitise. We have used objects to investigate the different ways we can make these numbers. We have also been using a 5 frame and adding 1 more.

Christmas has officially begun this week in Ladybirds! We have listened to our Nativity songs and even started to learn one of them.






Woodland

In English, Woodland Class have been using co-ordinating conjunctions to join clauses together. Year 1 focused on using the conjunction 'and', whilst Year 2 were also challenged to use 'or' and 'but'. The children have also been designing their very own extraordinary garden in preparation for their description writing next week.

In maths, Year 1 have started learning about subtraction and have been finding addition and subtraction fact families for a group of 3 numbers. Year 2 have been learning how to subtract a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number and have also been finding 10 more and 10 less than a given number.

In science, the children have been learning about the weather in autumn and winter. This week they watched a weather report before planning and presenting their own. In history the children used all of their knowledge from this term to compare the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. Miss Smith was very impressed by all of the interesting facts that Woodland Class were able to recall!







Kestrel

In English this week we have continued our work on the story 'Trust'. We have been looking at different ways that authors can build tension and excitement using different techniques, including similes and character description. We then used pictures as stimulus to have a go at using similes to describe a setting and a character description. As it was Children in Need, we used Pudsey as our character!





Kestrels started the week with an exciting maths lesson to introduce them to Maths Week. They followed instructions to create Waldorf stars, which are now beautifully decorating the classroom.



In mathematics, Dolphins have continued their unit of work on addition and subtraction, this week they have been looking at related facts. They have been spotting patterns and using addition facts they already know to calculate the answers to more complex addition questions. Nemos have moved onto column subtraction and have been completing questions where they have needed to exchange 100s and 10s. Frogs have completed their unit of work on area by looking at calculating the area of shapes and also comparing the area of different shapes.

In science, the children began their next unit of work which focuses on nutrition, healthy eating and skeletons. This week we learnt all about the five main food groups, looking at how they help to keep our body healthy and also thinking of different food examples for each group.

We finished the week by designing new outfits for Pudsey, to celebrate Children in Need.

This week, we have written a balanced argument about whether children should have been evacuated or not from London during WWII. We have found it interesting: we even found out that they started evacuating children before the war even began. We think it was actually a good thing that they were evacuated because it meant that they were safe from the bombing raids that were about to begin in the cities around the UK. We also looked into the reasons why the war began in the first place. We didn't realise that the German people before WWII felt very frustrated and upset about the Treaty of Versailles after WW1, as it took away a lot of their land and made them pay money to the other countries. A few children brought in some WWII treasures this week, and they enjoyed sharing them with the class, including a WWII newspaper, some coins, an authentic air raid patrol whistle and even some medals.
