Weekly Round Up

Ladybirds

Ladybirds were quite intrigued to watch an original Magic Roundabout Christmas episode. This was used as a basis for our Drawing Club. Our vocabulary that was linked to this was bewildered, cloggy, magic, arrive, groaned, flustered, disguise and pacing. We enjoyed looking at the characters, choosing our own setting, invented a machine to make it snow and designed a new sleigh for Santa to make it go faster. It is lovely to see the confidence in the children wanting to have a go at writing a sentence to explain their code.

We have been very busy with learning our Nativity songs this week and went down to the church to have a practice.

Woodland

In English, Woodland Class have been writing information leaflets about winter. In their leaflets, the children have included key features including subheadings, pictures, facts and information. The children enjoyed writing their leaflets using their knowledge from our science topic.

In mathematics, Year 1 and Year 2 have been recapping all of their place value and addition and subtraction skills. The children have also enjoyed using the polydron during their rainbow challenge time to build and make 3D shapes.

In science, the children have finished their topic on seasonal change. Over the past few weeks in forest school, Woodland Class have been investigating how much rainfall we have had. The children collected their results and have put them into a bar graph to see which week had the most rain. We also had another look at the months of the year and ordered them before matching them to their seasons.

Kestrel

In English this week the children have been using their planning and text maps from last week to write their innovated versions of Trust. We have had some great stories about 'stolen' raffle tickets, money and precious items. It turns out that none of these items were actually stolen and it was a big misunderstanding between the friends.

In mathematics Dolphins have been using their number bonds to 10 to help them with adding three 1-digit numbers and have also been adding to the next 10. Nemos have continued their work on multiplying and dividing by focusing on multiples of 2, 5 and 10, looking at sharing and grouping and also multiplying and dividing by 3. Frogs have been focusing on multiplying a number by 1 and 0, dividing a number by 1 and itself and also multiplying 3 numbers.

In history this week we have been looking at how life changed in the Bronze Age and have been making comparisons to life in the Stone Age. The children made comparisons between different aspects of life, such as: their homes, the food they ate, what they wore and the tools they used.

Osprey

The festive season has begun in Osprey class, we have decorated parts of the classroom. In our class there is an advent calendar, where every day we pick someone to do an act of kindness, to earn a chocolate. We have also started to practise our nativity.

In English this week we have finished writing a time travel story that we are going to edit and eventually write up into our FAB (finished article books) books. We have enjoyed this because we have been able to think about our own story and setting. The Silver Sword has been particularly thrilling this week because we are further into the story and there is more action. We have also combined our reading with geography by using maps to follow the journey of the characters.

We have learnt a bit more about the key events of WWII in our history lessons, and we placed them onto a timeline.

We did mathematics as a class this week, using our times tables facts and looking at multiplication. Some of us definitely found it easier than before, by using the grid method, as we get to partition the numbers and then are able to multiply smaller numbers.

In swimming this week, we had a choice between doing races or playing water-polo. The majority of the class voted to play water-polo, it was fun and very competitive at the same time.

Music was enjoyable but also difficult because there are lots of notes to play. We have learnt to perform Jingle Bells on the trumpet.

In other news:

Punctuality

There are still a number of families who are arriving after 8.45am on a regular basis, from January anyone who is late will need to be signed in by the adult bringing them to school. Those who are repeatedly late will be invited in to discuss how we can help in the mornings.

Being late for school adds up to lost learning:

- 5 minutes late each day adds up to over 3 days lost each year
- 15minutes late each day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year


