Weekly Round Up

Forest School

It had been another busy week in Forest School, some of the children have been identifying plants, Woodland Class have been building bridges by learning to layer lengths of wood, they had lots of fun testing the bridge. They have also been using ropes to pull themselves up the tree. Osprey Class set up a Forest School Band and set about band practice. Ladybirds have had a lot of fun making an obstacle course!



Pebbles Nursery

This week Pebbles have joined in with the Buckinghamshire Early Years' Communication Week, their days have been filled with poetry, singing, reading and lots of activities to encourage them to CHAT! They have enjoyed listening to the story 'Are you a Monster?', singing the noisy monster song and making their own monster pictures using loose parts. These all sparked wonderful conversations.

Pebbles have also been using puppets to put on puppet shows, mark making in the garden and making play telephones out of paper cups and string. They all enjoyed the teddy bears' picnic and playing party games.

The highlight of the week was listening to the story 'The Blue Balloon' which was brought to life with a real blue balloon!



Ladybirds

It has been lovely to see all the children back and feeling better. This week we have continued our dinosaur theme. We have a new text in Talk 4 Writing and the childen have been learning a story The Little Green Dinosaur by heart. The hook into the story started with searching the garden for all the lost dinosaurs, after they were safely collected we listened to our focus text about a lost dinosaur. The story map will be available on Google Classroom to practise at home. In maths we have been building numbers 9 and 10; we have had lots of practical experience of counting and sorting numbers fewer and more than.

In phonics we have continued to read longer words by chunking them. We are recapping all sounds and working on tricky words. We have continued to have lots of fun playing in slime and the mud kitchen making meals for the dinosaurs!




Woodland

In English, Woodland Class have been innovating the Gruffalo to write their own defeat the monster tales. At the beginning of the week, the children designed a new monster character and wrote some rhyming sentences to describe its features. There were stinkalos, tuskalos, and slimealos! The children then planned the rest of their stories by changing the woodland creatures before writing their own versions with a focus on the using adjectives, question marks and contractions.

In mathematics, Year 1 have started their unit on length and height. The children have enjoyed measuring a range of classroom objects using cubes and even had a competition to see who could build the tallest tower. In Year 2, the children have finished their unit on multiplication and division. This week they have been learning about the 5- times table and have looked at similarities between the 5- and 10-times tables.

In geography, the children have been learning about amenities within in our local community. We looked at some of the key places in Ibstone including St Nicholas' Church and our school. The children then completed a class survey to vote which amenity they thought was the most important. They then created a bar graph to show the results of the survey.

In science, the children have been learning to identify the offspring and parent of an animal. We discussed how most animals inherit features from their parents but some animals like a butterfly can look very different from their offspring.



Kestrel

In English this week, the children have continued with activities based on our story 'Adventure at Sandy Cove'. They have completed a reading comprehension, where we focused on sequencing and short answer questions, and they also did an accurate write of the story. The children have also completed some activities to celebrate World Book Day. They took part in a book scavenger hunt - they had to find different things in books (e.g. a word you don't know the meaning of, a sentence that should be shouted or whispered, a surprising event). The children also designed new front covers for one of their favourite books.

In mathematics Nemos have been learning all about perimeter. They have been measuring shapes to find the perimeter and also calculating the perimeter when they already know the lengths of some or all of the sides. Frogs have continued their unit of work on fractions and have been learning about mixed numbers and improper fractions.

In geography this week, we continued to look at the impact that volcanoes can have on peoples lives. We recapped the advantages and disadvantages, and thought about ranking them from the best advantage to the worst disadvantage.

In science we have finished our unit of work by recapping what we have learnt this term about nutrition, skeletons and muscles.

In PSHE the children discussed how sometimes things happen so plans have to change and they may have to deal with disappointment and show resilience. They worked in groups to role play different scenarios; thinking about what they might have to do if they were in those situations.

During their swimming lessons this week, the children learnt all about water safety. They had to bring in some pyjamas to wear so that they could experience what it would be like to fall into water in their clothes and have to swim to safety. While each child was swimming everyone else sat on the side kicking their legs to mimic a tide/current, the children found that it was much harder to swim during these conditions. They also learnt what to do if they found someone in trouble in water.



Osprey

This week we have been enjoying researching more about rivers. We found out about the features of a river and really enjoyed presenting the information in our own way – showing what good independent learners we are!

In English we are looking at suspense writing and thinking about how we can put suspense and tension into our own work. We will be using all the ideas to write a chapter full of suspense, based on our class book, Brightstorm. Whilst reading Brightstorm this week, we have been using the dictionaries a lot and have added even more words to our Word Wall.

In mathematics, the Mountains group have just finished their topic all about perimeter, area and volume. Rivers and Counties have continued their work on fractions and decimals.
