Weekly Round Up

Pebbles Nursery

Pebbles have enjoyed the sunshine this week, they have been learning about keeping safe in the sun. They have talked about why they wear hats and why it is important for them to wear suncream. They have also taken part in a water challenge to keep themselves hydrated.

There has been lots of waterplay to help keep them cool and they have all enjoyed using water and paintbrushes to paint the ground and the side of the hall.

They made a big bus from the play bricks and loose parts and set off on an adventure. They stopped at the beach, the farm and a museum! What a busy day! Everyone joined in with 'The Wheels on the Bus' and there was great excitement as they described what they could see out of the window!



Ladybirds

We have been continuing with our Talk 4 Writing story, The Very Sleepy Bumble Bee. We used a story map to learn the story last week, we also thought of lots of different words for sleepy. We retold the story through small world characters and ordered pictures. This week we focused on changing part of the story and learning our new version. All the children have planned their own version and have started to retell their story. We are looking forward to finishing the stories next week. There are some excellent ideas, including The Shattered Snake, The Dozy Ladybird, The Tired T-Rex and The Exhausted Butterfly. They have really wowed us with how independent they are becoming in their writing.

In mathematics we have been recapping on repeating patterns and looking at the vocabulary used to describe position. They played a position challenge game and had to give their friend instructions as to where the character should be, for example, put the cow next to the tree.

We were very excited to see that our caterpillars had now emerged as butterflies and we were able to observe them closely in their butterfly house. After checking their wings were dry, we let them free in our garden so we can spot them in Forest School. We have also been busy making clay models and homes for minibeasts using natural materials.

We have enjoyed cooling down with lots of water play!





Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been busy writing their innovated versions of Dogger. On Monday, the children planned their new versions of the story. Year 1 drew their new characters and missing objects onto story maps whilst Year 2 were further challenged to adapt the ending of the story. The children have been working hard to use a range of time openers and interesting adjectives in their writing.

In mathematics, Year 1 have completed their unit on money. This week they have been learning how to recognise notes and have been using their knowledge of 2s, 5s and 10s to count in coins. Year 2 have continued their work on statistics. This week they have been learning about pictograms and how to interpret information from them.

In DT, the children have been researching and designing their own puppets. First, the children looked at a selection of different puppets including hand puppets, shadow puppets and finger puppets. The children were then introduced to the puppet show Punch & Judy and watched a short video clip to see the puppets in action. We then designed a new puppet characters to join the show and practised using a running stitch in preparation to make our own.





Kestrel Class

In English this week, the children looked at the structure of The Big Bad Wolf and identified the focus of each of the paragraphs. They then used this structure to plan their own biography about a fictional character. They have chosen a range of fictional characters, including: superheroes; fairy tale characters and characters from Disney films. They are using their boxing up as well as the toolkit to support them with writing their biographies. I am really looking forward to reading them when they are finished.

In maths, the 'Nemos' have begun a unit of work on shape. They have been looking at acute, obtuse and right angles and learning to identify and compare them. They have also focused on horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines. The 'Frogs' finished their unit on shape by learning about lines of symmetry. They have then begun a statistics unit of work looking at interpreting pictograms, bar charts and line graphs.


In science this week, the children have been learning about how water is transported through plants; learning about the xylem, phloem and stomata. We also looked at the parts of a flower and begun to learn the names of the different parts. The children also learnt how the different parts play a role in pollination and the creation of a new plant.

Opsrey Class

This week, we put on our architect hats and embarked on an incredible project: designing a new community hub for the village of Ibstone! The children really showed fantastic creativity and innovation in their designs. Delving into the life and works of the Austrian-born architect Friedensreich Hundertwasser, they also enjoyed creating a double page spread. His vibrant and imaginative buildings filled with bold colours, organic forms, and irregular shapes fascinated us all. We also learned how he believed in harmony between nature and human-made structures, a philosophy that surely inspired our community hub designs.

In English this week we wrote poetry about our memories of being in Osprey class. We really have got some great memories for us to take away.

In mathematics, some of us have been busy planning a family holiday. We had to calculate budgets, research destinations, and even plan itineraries! This project helped practice addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division in real-life scenarios. Meanwhile, others have been exploring the world of angles and 3D shapes: recognising different types of angles and how to measure them.
