Weekly Round Up

Pebbles Nursery

Pebbles have been working hard to develop their physical skills and enjoyed practising for their sports day. They have been balancing a ball on a plate, walking along a skipping rope without falling into the lava and been practising jumping with two feet together! Ladybirds

Ladybirds have been very busy finishing their stories and retelling their own version of the Sleepy Bumblebee. In phonics we have revisited some tricky words and looked at how the root word changes when we add est and er to a word.

In mathematics, we have been looking at maps and using bricks and objects to build models of the school. We have thought about our journey to school and what we pass along the way.

They all had lots of fun at their sports day and were all amazing at taking part and encouraging their friends.

Ladybirds enjoyed their diamond power treat; popcorn was chosen this time which they enjoyed whilst watching an episode of Bluey!



Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been busy creating and writing their own losing tales. The children have been working hard to embellish their stories by adding interesting adjectives and time openers for our writing toolkit.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been looking at the months of the year and have been learning how to remember the number of days in each month. Year 2 have been learning how to describe movement by using the language of up, down, left, right, forwards and backwards.

In DT, the children have started making their Punch and Judy inspired puppets. This week the children drew round a stencil to create their puppet shape before sewing or gluing on features to decorate their puppets. The children are looking forward to sewing them together next week.

As part of our RE learning, the children also enjoyed their trip to Wycombe Mosque. The children listened carefully and learnt lots of new and interesting facts. The children also enjoyed the opportunity to take part in a prayer that was demonstrated by the Imam.

Kestrel Class

In mathematics, the Nemos have continued their work on shape and learnt about parallel and perpendicular lines. They also practised drawing polygons before moving onto recognising and describing 2D and 3D shapes. The Frogs finished their statistics unit by looking at line graphs and then started a new unit of work on position and direction. They have started learning about co-ordinates, including reading and plotting them.

In DT this week, the children have started looking at seasonal foods around the world. We began by using an atlas to locate the different countries that certain fruit and vegetables are grown in. We then discussed how foods are seasonal but we import fruit and vegetables into the UK so that we can enjoy them all year round. The children then explored some of the pros and cons to importing food. We then looked at different seasonal fruits and vegetables in the UK and the children had the opportunity to try some that are currently in season here. I am really proud of all the children as they all tried lots of the different fruits and vegetables, even if they thought they didn't like it.




Osprey Class

Some of the children found it a bit strange when they went to the secondary schools, that they had to go to different classrooms for different lessons, but we're sure they will get used to it quite quickly. The rest of the Year 6 group started a pond project by clearing out the area and beginning to dig the hole. It will be 2 ft deep, so that's a lot of digging.

On Thursday, we had sports day that included various activities that the children took part in, and some of the adults. They enjoyed participating in the 400m Relay, Egg and Spoon race, 100m and the family activities. After that, Osprey class were lucky enough to go on to watch A Midsummer Night's Dream at Garsington Opera House. It was very interactive, fun and very loud!

The rest of the week in class, has been spent coding on computers. We directed Tina (AKA the computer) to draw houses made of shapes, using special commands. It was very confusing to start but then we tinkered with it and figured it out, with a little bit of perseverance.
