Weekly Round Up

Pebbles Nursery

Pebbles have been investigating and experimenting with different ways to join pipes together to make a giant marble run for the plastic balls. They discovered ways to make the balls go faster or slower. Some children played 'ball pool waterfall', they stood under the bog pipe as an avalanche of balls cascaded down!

They have also enjoyed dancing and singing to a variety of songs and rhymes, in fact they enjoyed dancing so much they have asked to dance every morning.

We have all missed one of our Pebbles this week! We hope you feel better soon, we can't wait to see you when you are well enough!



Ladybirds

Ladybirds had a lovely trip to the Cotswold Wildlife Park on Monday which everyone thoroughly enjoyed; we all certainly got our steps in! We were very lucky as we escaped any rain clouds around. They were certainly impressed by the size of the giant anaconda we saw!

We have enjoyed lots of stories linked to many of the animals we spotted on Monday and have thought about where in the world they come from. We have made our own wildlife park with the animals and created our own wildlife maps. We have created some beautiful sunset paintings with African animals. We have been recapping on number bonds, lots of counting and looking at the correct number formation in maths.



Woodland Class

For Geography week, Woodland Class have been learning about seasides and coasts. The children have located seaside towns in the UK on a map and have investigated the seaside town of Lyme Regis. The children have also learnt about physical and human features of the coast and have made models using papier mâché.

In English, the children have written spine poems about the seaside, using a video and pictures as a stimulus. We described nouns such as waves, seagulls, lighthouses and cliffs and thought of interesting adverbs and similes.

In mathematics, Year 1 completed their unit on time and have been learning to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour. Year 2 have completed their unit on position and direction and have been learning to describe turns and movement.



Kestrel Class

In mathematics, Nemos moved onto a unit of work on statistics. They studied pictograms and bar charts; interpreting information from them and then they also had a go at drawing their own. The children then learnt about two way tables and answered questions about the information presented. Frogs continued their work on co-ordinates, using them to translate objects on a grid and also describing translations.

In DT this week, the children worked in small groups to design their own seasonal fruit or vegetable tart. They were only allowed to select fruits and vegetables that are currently in season in the UK. Later in the week the children then made, tasted and evaluated their seasonal tarts. The children really enjoyed making them and also enjoyed eating them! They all worked really well in their groups to combine all of their ideas and also share out the different jobs when making the seasonal tarts.

As part of Geography week, the children looked at the country of origin of the foods they tasted last week. We then discussed what food miles were and the impact they can have on the environment. The children calculated the food miles each fruit or vegetable had travelled to get to us here in lbstone.

The children also learnt about grid references, which are very similar to the co-ordinates that Frogs had just been learning about in maths. The children learnt what grid references were and how to read and write 4 figure grid references. They then used these to locate different places on an Ordnance Survey map.

Osprey Class

This week in Osprey, we have been learning as hard as ever, given that it's nearly the summer holidays. We have been focusing on Geography as it is Geography week, after all.

On Tuesday, the children enjoyed starting their Geography field study project, by creating questionnaires and asking people things that they might like if we were to buy the field next to school and build a community hub. On Wednesday we went to the Wycombe Museum. It was so fun, we also got to dress up as if we were working in a chair factory. The ladies did lace making and washing, whilst the men were out being "Bodgers" or "Bottomers". Bottomers were the people who made the bottom of the chair that you sit on and the bodgers made everything round, including the legs and stretchers.

We also loved it this week, when a special visitor - Miss McKeown - came in to see us, after she had left for her new job, which she said is going very well, but is not as fun as when she worked here!

Next week is Ibfest Week. Ibfest is a week of creative arts across the school. During the week, the children will work in their family groups, classes and year groups to learn new skills, access art and design opportinuites, sing, dance and perform in a small group as well as in larger and whole school groups.
