Dear Families,



#### Weekly Round Up

#### Ladybirds

Ladybirds have been looking for shapes in the environment this week and have used 2D shapes to make shape patterns. The have also been using 3D shapes to make models of houses and homes.



They have all continued to work hard on learning the phonemes ck, e, u and r and have been practising blending words. They have also been recognising 'l' and 'is' in a range of contexts. All the children enjoyed painting their names.

#### Woodland

In English, Woodland Class have been looking at the book 'The Colour Monster'. The children have enjoyed taking part in Drawing Club to draw parts of their story before writing a code to make their characters and settings come to life. There have had lots of creative ideas including camouflaging monsters and emotion jars being protected by dragons!



#### Issue 6 13.10.23

In mathematics, Year 1 have started learning about addition and subtraction. This week they have been learning about parts and wholes and have been using part-whole models to write addition number sentences. The children really enjoyed building part-whole models practically outside using hoops and beanbags. Year 2 have also started their addition and subtraction unit by recapping number bonds and fact families within 20.



In science, the children took part in a science experiment to use their sense of smell. The children worked in small groups to smell the mystery cups and identify the smells including cocoa powder, toothpaste and vinegar. Year 2 were also challenged to think of words to describe the smells.

In RE, the children continued learning about creation. This week, the children were thinking about how God would want his world to be looked after. To explore this, the children made their own animal creations using Play-Doh before squashing them. The children then discussed how this made them feel before linking this to God and his creation.

#### Kestrel

This week in English the children have designed their own imaginary world and have begun planning a portal story with this as the setting.



In mathematics, Dolphins have been comparing and ordering numbers using the vocabulary *greater than*, less *than* and *equal to* and have also used the symbols for these (<, >, =). Nemos have begun their next unit of work on addition and subtraction, this week they have been focusing on adding 1s, 10s and 100s to 3-digit numbers. Frogs have also begun their unit of work on addition and subtraction and have been look at adding 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s to 4-digit numbers. They have then moved onto using column addition to add pairs of 4-digit numbers, including where an exchange needs to be made.

In history we looked at a source related to the Stone Age. We discussed what this source was, when it was made and what we could learn about the Stone Age by looking at it. It was a colour photograph of the inside of a cave with remnants of flint stones and deer antlers. As a class they identified that the photo must have been taken during modern day times as the Stone Age people did not have colour cameras!

In science we have been looking at magnets. We looked at different types of magnets and discussed where the north and south pole are on these different ones. We then explored what happens when like poles are placed together and what happens when opposite poles are put together.

#### Osprey

Osprey Class have been busy working in their family groups to write poems for the Harvest service, they used the photo below as a starting point and have wowed us with their creativity. They are looking forward to sharing their poems with you next week.



In science they have been conducting investigations looking at irreversible changes. They made casein plastic by mixing warm milk and vinegar together, it was used in the 1900's to make buttons and jewellery, I am not sure that Osprey Class will be trying it at home as they were not impressed with the smell! They also mixed vinegar with bicarbonate of soda to inflate balloons!





I was very proud of all of the whole class on Wednesday when I joined them for swimming, their manners, politeness, determination and perserverance shone through as they honed their swimming skills. I was very impressed with the swimming I saw, in paticular, the group that were practising butterfly! These happy faces capture their enjoyment perfectly!
