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Dear Families,

The term is well underway and it has been a very busy week here in school. Our 5th and 6th groups of KS2 swimmers have started their 6 week block of swimming, they all wowed us all with their perseverance, resilience and courage. Well done children!

This week in Worship we have thought about Spirituality and have been reminding ourselves about kintsugi. We looked at our kintsugi bowl on the Worship table and remembered that pots can crack and break, just like sometimes things can happen that can make us feel cracked or broken. It doesn't mean that we have to throw the broken pot away or give up, we can fill and mend the gaps. In the case of the bowl, we used golden glue to repair it, it looks different but has a new beauty and can continue to be used. Christians believe whatever happens to them in life, God is with them. God can fill and mend the gaps and put people back together. Spirituality is like that golden glue. We have talked about how Ibstone has its own Ibstone glue that helps and nurtures us all, a bit like that golden glue too!

We also talked about Ow's, Wow's and Now's and the children shared their own moments.

On Tuesday we thought talked about how things happening in the world can also make us have Ow, Wow and Now moments, we linked this to our Windows, Mirrors and Doors.

Windows: Looking out - what is happening in the world and giving us all opportunities to become aware of the world in new ways. Learning about life in all its fullness. This includes both the things that amaze them and also challenge them.

Mirrors: Looking inwards/ Reflecting - giving us all opportunities to reflect on our experiences. Asking questions. How has that made you feel? Why?

Doors: Act/ Respond – gives us opportunities to respond, stepping out to make a difference no matter how big or small. Living out our vision and values past the school gates.

Weekly Round Up

Pebbles

The children had great fun building a police car out of loose parts and pretending to be police officers. On Monday Leigh, our school librarian, came to talk to us about books. We learnt about fiction and non-fiction books and we told Leigh what our favourite books are. On Thursday the children went on an exciting journey in the school minibus to the post box near the common, they enjoyed stretching up really high to post their letters home.

In dance and movement this week we moved to music and songs from different books, including The Gruffalo, Room on a Broom and The Very Hungry Caterpillar. The children enjoyed changing from a caterpillar to a beautiful butterfly.







Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds we have been thinking about who we have in our community that helps us, we have enjoyed making maps and models to represent this. Our focus has been on librarians and the children listened to Leigh whilst she came to talk to them about her job in our school library and Marlow library where she also works. The children then explored our library choosing their new books and listened carefully while Leigh read them her favourite story. The children have all been busy on a special task so keep an eye on the post box!

In mathematics the focus has been on deepening the understanding of numbers up to 5, we have been working on the part whole model using number 5. We have played many games to help represent number bonds to 5.

In phonics the new sounds of the week have been oo (as in zoom) oo (as in book) ar, or. The tricky words have been was, you and they.







Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been learning their new Talk 4 Writing text 'Monstersaurus'. On Monday, the children became detectives as our classroom had been left in a very messy state. The children used clues from the crime scene to make predictions about what had happened. We have also enjoyed talking about the story and learning it off-by-heart using actions.

In mathematics, Year 1 have continued learning about place value and have been building teen numbers using different resources including Numicon and dienes. Year 2 have continued learning about shape. This week they have learnt about lines of symmetry and have identified the properties of 3D shapes.

In history, the children used a range of historical sources to work out when, where and how the fire started. The children first worked in small groups to identify the historical sources before piecing them together to make a prediction.

In computing, the children have been learning about algorithms. We started by watching a dinosaur game made on Scratch. We discussed how the game worked by watching what happened to the dinosaur everytime a button was pressed. The children then worked in pairs to create their own algorithm for the dinosaur such as pressing 'R' to make it roar.







Kestrel Class

In English this week, the children have been introduced to our new focus text, 'The Canal'. We have created a Performers' Toolkit to help us with our drama tools when we retell the text. There has been lots of enthusiasm when creating the actions to help us and we have learnt new key vocabulary that will support our understanding of the text.

In mathematics, Nemos have been working on multiplication and division. They have continued multiplying and dividing 2-digit by 1-digit numbers; also learning about exchanging and remainders. Frogs have also been working multiplication and division and learning about related multiplication and division facts. They have also looked at informal written methods to multiply a 2-digit by a 1-digit number.

In PSHE, we have been thinking about when we may have faced a difficult challenge or achieved success. We have discussed our own personal goals and also the views of others. In groups, the children looked at some images and had some thoughtful conversations on their perspective and how others might be feeling.





Osprey Class

This week we have enjoyed looking at the Ancient Greeks in History, and finding out where and when they existed. We can't wait to find out more about this ancient civilisation. We have also started reading our new class book, "The Adventures of Odysseus", which is a classic tale taken from Greek mythology. In addition, we have been looking at other Greek myths in our English lessons. Our model text this term is the story of Perseus and Medusa, we have now learnt all of the text map.

In mathematics, we have finished off our topic of multiplication and we are now looking at short division. We have agreed that we need to carry on learning our times-tables at home, to help us with this.



Barn Owls

In English this week, we have innovated our story 'The Tale of Curious Cara' together. In our new story, our main character, Jack, was practising football in his garden. He kicked the ball over his fence into the woods and despite warnings, jumped over the fence to collect it. In the woods he met a bear!

In mathematics, we have been revising our 2, 5 and 10 times tables. We have compared calculations deciding whether to use the more than, less than or the equals symbol. We have explored word problems looking at how to apply our knowledge of these tables to solve the problems.
