Weekly Round Up

Pebbles

This week Pebbles have enjoyed playing with rice, scooping it up and pouring and tipping it to make pretend cakes. This week we have been working on learning basic shapes, the children have enjoyed painting circles, squares and triangles, they have used different bricks to print shapes. They also loved washing up the wooden printing blocks too! They have played shape games and made shape people!

We have also been finding out about vets and have played in the 'Vet Surgery' in the classroom. We helped make the animals better, we bandaged poorly paws, wrote medical notes and gave the patients lots of love and care.



Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds we have been finding out about the role of a vet, we have loved having our own surgery open for treating lots of poorly cats and dogs! We have used the story 'Mog and the VET' for our Drawing Club focus this week. This led to some super codes and drawings to invent a way to get Mog into her basket. We have also made some balancing cats.

In mathematics we have been exploring weight; initially looking at heavier and lighter and then reading the story Who sank the Boat? Paper boats and Lego boats were made to see how many people they could fit into their boat before it sank. Using the story 'Balancing Act' the children enjoyed finding out how many bricks it would take to balance the scales, hence finding the mass. They also had a lot of fun exploring different containers in capacity, using rice and sand, and comparing which would hold the most.

In phonics our sounds of the week are ur, ow, oi, & ear. The tricky words are my, by, all.



Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been learning how to use a list of 3 to describe a setting. They have also been learning how to use powerful verbs and adverbs to improve sentences and have used these to write a list poem about a laboratory from our story 'Monstersaurus'.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been practising their number line skills and have been using them to find one more and one less than a given number. Year 2 have finished their unit on shape. This week they have been learning to sort 3D shapes and have been using 2D and 3D shapes to make patterns.

In science, the children enjoyed taking part in an investigation to identify the properties of materials. In small groups, the children selected a material and worked together to identify its properties such as hard, soft, transparent and opaque.

In history, the children have been developing their chronology skills by ordering events along a timeline. We started by looking at birthdays and ordered members of our class along a timeline. We then looked at significant historical events including The Great Fire of London and worked in small groups to make a timeline. Finally we looked at the events of the great fire and made our own timelines independently.



Kestrel Class

In English this week, the children have continued to learn our new focus text. They have really worked hard to perform using the actions to help secure their understanding of the story. After a discussion of what the setting looked like, they painted their own interpretation and produced some fantastic pieces of art. We have also continued to focus on inverted commas, which will support their writing when it comes to using dialogue within their text.

In mathematics, Nemos have started their new unit on Length and Perimeter. They have been measuring and comparing centimetres and millimetres; also learning how to use a ruler with accuracy. Frogs have continued to work on multiplication and division. They have been multiplying and dividing 2-digit and 3-digit numbers by 1; with and without remainders.

In History, we have been learning about where the Anglo-Saxons originated from and how their name came to be. We looked at maps to compare the seven Anglo-Saxon Kingdoms with the UK as we know it today. The class learnt the names of the seven Kingdoms and were able to locate each one on a map.



Osprey Class

In mathematics we have been learning how to do division, using different methods to make sure we are being efficient in our work. The Year 6s have extended their knowledge of the subject, by finding out how to do long division.

In English we have been studying and practising how to write our own Greek Myth. We have also been exploring the Greek Gods in history and learning their names. In art we have been looking at their special objects and drawing them. We also finished our Space pictures.

This week in Forest School we made a ride and we decided to call it The Harry Potter Ride because it was shaped like a broom. We also made a ladder to climb up to a platform in the tree.







Barn Owls

In English this week, we have used our imaginations to create our own unique ideas to innovate our story 'The Tale of Curious Cara'. We are looking forward to seeing these stories grow over the next week. We have looked at how to use inverted commas (also known as speech marks) before and after direct speech to show what someone has said.

In mathematics, we have been revising our 3, 4 and 8 times tables. We have compared calculations deciding whether to use the more than, less than or the equals symbol. We have explored word problems looking at how to apply our knowledge of these tables to solve the problems.

The whole school are making super progress in their ballet sessions. As most groups have asked to learn how to twirl, Jacqui has suggested that if your child has a pair of Rush grippy socks (or any brand grippy socks) please could they bring them in on their PE day as wearing them will help with learning to twirl.
