
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Dear Families,

The first full week back in school has flown by! It is wonderful to hear the enthusiasm for learning and the buzz in each classroom as you walk around the school site. In Worship this week we have been thinking about Perseverance, the whole school community have shared examples of how they have perservered and some shared what they felt they need to persevere with in their learning.

We talked about perseverance being something that everyone will need in life and that as a school community we will help develop everyone's perserverance and help them keep going, even when things might feel impossible.



Ladybirds

Ladybirds have had lots of fun getting to know their new friends. They are really enjoying time with their buddies each day. We have played lots of games together to help everyone learn each other's names. They have been amazing at working on their diamond power, keeping the cloakroom tidy. In Jigsaw (our circle time) the children have practised calm me time and have met Jerrie cat and Jigsaw Jem. They have also created some super self portrait paintings. Ladybirds also had a lot of fun in their first PE and Forest School sessions.













Woodland Class

In English, Woodland Class have been revising capital letters and have been learning how to use them for the names of people and places. They have also been learning to punctuate sentences using full stops and capital letters and have been practising their writer's toolkit by forming simple sentences.

In mathematics, the children have started their units on place value. In Year 1, the children have been learning to represent objects using tens frames and recognising numbers within 10 as words. In Year 2, the children have been recapping numbers to 20 and have been learning how to build 2-digit numbers using a place value chart.

In science, the children have been learning about different animal groups. This week, the children identified features of different animals and sorted them into groups including mammals, birds, reptiles, fish and amphibians.

In geography, the children have been using atlases to identify and locate the seven continents and five oceans of the world. Some Year 2 children also enjoyed the challenge of putting the continents in size order.



Kestrel Class

In English the children have been learning about prepositions and personification. They have then been using both of these descriptive techniques to begin adding more detail to a setting description. The children have been learning how to use prepositions to describe where objects are and learning how personification can be used to give objects human like qualities.

In mathematics Nemos have started their unit of work on place value and have been looking at representing numbers to 100 and learning how we can partition them. They have then looked at identifying missing numbers on different number lines up to 100. Frogs have also begun their place value unit of work. They have been learning how to represent and partition numbers to 1000 and have then been identifying missing numbers on numbers up to 1000.

We have begun our **Explore** unit of work by looking at our enquiry question and our key concepts. We started by discussing the term 'sustainability' and we will continue to think about how this links to our enquiry concept and our rainforest topic throughout the term. We started by looking at where rainforests are situated in the world and the children used atlases to identify countries on the world map that contain rainforests.

In science we have started our states of matter unit of work. The children have been learning all about solids, liquids and gases. They have been looking at sorting objects into the different states and have also learnt about the different properties of solids, liquids and gases.





Osprey Class

What a great start to the year, Osprey class have had! It all began last week with a surprise visit from an astronaut. They told us all about what it was like to live on the International Space Station, which really got us excited for our new topics this term. We have started finding out all about space in Science, and have come up with some great questions that we would like to research. In computing, we even worked out an amazing fact: Did you know that it would take 4.5 billion double decker buses to reach Mars from Earth! In English we have started our new Talk 4 Writing text, all about the Canadian astronaut, Chris Hadfield. We have also begun our new class book, Cosmic by Frank Cottrell Boyce. We are finding it really funny, and also enjoyed sharing an extract from one of his other books in Guided Reading.

In Geography we enjoyed looking through our new atlases this week, and discovering all about the continent of North America. We even managed to locate most of the 23 countries!

In mathematics, we have been looking at numbers to a million. We have enjoyed using the dienes, counters and other resources to help us consolidate our understanding of place value even more.





Barn Owls

Barns Owls have had a super first week working with Mrs Burkitt, they have enjoyed taking part in some getting to know you activities, looking at facts about Barn Owls and some children had the chance to draw barn owls.

In English they have started their unit on Dragons! They have shared their ideas, listened to the story of George and the Dragon and explored descriptions of the might dragon. They are looking forward to finding out what happens next week.

In mathematics, they have been focusing on place value. They have been using and making numbers using tens and ones to 100 and have also starting combining 100's 10's and 1's.
