In Worship this week we have been thinking about Respect, the whole school community listened to the story of The Good Samaritan. Across the course of the week we have thought about and discussed how we show respect and how we respect ourselves. We talked about what it means to be a good neighbour and how we can be a good neighbour both in and out of school, we also clarified that it didn't just mean the people you sit next to or live next door to!

#### Weekly Round Up

#### **Pebbles**

Pebbles have been getting to know different adults in our school this week, across the week they have been playing with Mrs Statham and Miss Lever. On Tuesday they enjoyed storytime with Mrs Earnshaw and today they have been shape painting with Mrs Senior! During the week some children have put on a dinosaur show at the theatre. All the children have had the opportunity to practise their cutting and sticking skills by making their own Humpty Dumptys. What a busy week it has been!



#### Ladybirds

This week in Ladybirds we have enjoyed singing the rhyme Humpty Dumpty with a focus on rhyming words and continuing a rhyming string. We have been building walls for Humpty to fall off and retelling the rhyme using our small world objects. Ladybirds have worked on their cutting skills and made their own Humpty Dumpty. We have thought about different materials and what things are made of and thought Humpty might need a crash mat to land on. We worked together to build a wall and made our own crash mat, we had fun testing out our different designs with some real eggs!

In phonics, we have been learning new sounds - i, n, m & d. We have started to blend cvc words. You should have received your child's Google Classroom login today, there are weekly Little Wandle Home Learning sheets which will help you support your child at home.

In mathematics we have continued with sorting different objects and enjoyed playing guess my rule; for example only the buttons with 2 holes can come into the set.



#### **Woodland Class**

In English, Woodland Class have enjoyed learning to retell the story of Handa's Surprise off-by-heart using actions. They have also been learning how to use adjectives to describe them and have used these to write spine poems about animals from the story.

In mathematics, Year 1 have been continuing to find one more and one less than a given number. They have also been learning to recognise and use the language of fewer, more and the same to describe an amount. Year 2 have continued their work on flexible partitioning and have been learning to write numbers to 100 in their expanded form.

In science, the children have been learning to describe the features of fish, reptiles and amphibians. The children first looked at pictures of each animal type and identified their key features before writing a riddle for their chosen animal.

In computing, the children have started learning about the key features of a computer. The children enjoyed working in pairs to create and label a picture of a laptop using the website Sketchpad. It was tricky at first to use the mouse pad, but with lots of perseverance and practise, the children were able to create some great diagrams.

#### **Kestrel Class**

In English this week the children began by learning how to punctuate speech accurately using inverted commas. We then discussed portal stories, exploring what they are and thinking of different examples of portal stories or movies involving portals. The children have started drawing a text map and learning the first few paragraphs of our focus text 'The Impossibly Possible Book Shop'.

In mathematics Nemos have been comparing and ordering numbers to 1000 and then counting in 50s. Frogs have been comparing and ordering numbers to 10,000 and then learning all about Roman Numerals.

During our 'Explore' lesson, we learnt about the different layers of the rainforest (emergent, canopy, understory and forest floor). The children learnt actions for the different layers to help them remember the order and the names. We learnt about the conditions in the different layers and the types of animals that live there.



#### **Osprey Class**

We have enjoyed reading some more of the Hidden Figures book this week in class, and have found out about more of the characters, including Mary Jackson and Katherine Johnson. It is fascinating discovering how they helped John Glenn be the first American to orbit the Earth.

In computing this week we are learning more about the Mars Rover and how it sends data back down to Earth, which meant that we had to learn all about binary coding.

In Geography we explored the geographical features of some of the North American countries and thought about whether they were physical or human features. We enjoyed finding out facts about the different features.

In Maths, we have been continuing our place value topic, and have been focusing on comparing and ordering numbers to a million, as well as rounding them.

We have enjoyed having conversations in French this week and learning how to say hello to each other.



#### **Barn Owls**

We started our week learning about noun phrases and how they can make our writing more interesting. We then moved on to innovating our story. It was no longer 'George and the Dragon' because in our story, the dragon was scared of spiders. We invented our own spiders...James, Dave, Stitch, Sidney, Gareth and Stella! When our spiders spun a web in the dragon's cave, the dragon flew away and fortunately was never seen again so the princess invited our spiders to move into the castle. In mathematics this week, we've been comparing and ordering 3 digit numbers. We have also counted in 50s to 1000.
