Dear Families,

Happy New Year! I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas! The children all enjoyed sharing their holiday news with us and have come back to school well rested and are all excited about their new topics this term.

This week the Ladybirds have started their Fairy Tales topic and have enjoyed listening to a range of stories. They have all written about the Frog Prince and Mrs Robertson and I were invited to a special performance of Cinderella yesterday afternoon. The Fairy Godmother definitely knew how to use her wand with conviction and Prince Charming was very kind to the unsuccessful ladies who tried on the shoe! In true fairy tale sytle, he eventually found Cinderella and they lived happily ever after!

In mathematics, the children have been looking at numbers to 20, they have been working on their number formation, counting given numbers of objects and matching numbers to amounts of objects.









Woodland Class have started their India topic and have thought of some excellent questions that that would like to explore and answer during their topic. They also enjoyed playing a variation of the shopping list game 'I went to Inida and I took...' and the challenge of remembering the items that everyone would take to India. The children then had to write lists of the things they would take.

In mathematics, they have been learning about multiplication and have made arrays to answer questions about the 2,5 & 10 time tables. In science, they have been finding out about various animals and sorted them into groups. The children have also been using their mapping skills to locate the continents of the world and to locate the UK and India. Woodland Class have also made a timeline to highlight historical events beyond living memory, this half term they will be focussed on 1666... I wonder if they can remember why?

Kestrel Class have been tapping into their imaginations and have created their own imaginary worlds this week. They have written an adventure story in their own world! I think Cloud Land would be a lovely place to visit! In mathematics, they have been learning about co-ordinates and have been reading and plotting co-ordinates on a map. They have also looked at a compass and learned about compass points. Some children had the challenge of using 6 figure grid references (I think I might pop down for some lessons!).
