#### What have we been learning this week?

Ladybirds have been reading 'Whatever Next' and have been role playing and sequencing the story. In mathematics, they have been exploring 3D shapes and making them into rockets, they have been counting 3D shapes in the environment, tallying to help them count and then recording their findings in a block graph!

To launch even further into their space topic the children have painted their feet to make rockets and have started

to think about the planets in the solar system. They have also been making moon sand for their space exploration. All the children enjoyed their first tennis session with

Coach Chris.







Woodland class have been writing descriptions of dragons and unicorns and I was amazing by some of the their descriptions...



In mathematics, they have been adding and subtracting 10. The Year 2 children have been using column addition and subtraction using regrouping. The Year 1 children have been using partitioning to help them add and subtract.

Kestrel Class found an alien egg with a letter explaining what it was and what it would need once it had hatched. The children had to write their own instructions to explain how to hatch the egg. They made Lego models of what the alien might look like. In mathematics, the children have been mutliplying and dividing by 10 and 100 to make tenths and hundreths. For example:  $6 \div 10 = 0.6$  and  $6 \times 100 = 600$ . The children have also been rounding to the nearest 10 or 100. They have been practising a ditty to help them to remember which way to round (up or down)

### 5 to 9, climb the vine! 0 to 4, slide to the floor!

In science they have made moving models to help them understand how the Earth rotates on its axis.


#### **KS1 Phonics Meeting**
