Dear Families,

It has been another busy week in school! Thank you for your donations today we have raised £55 for Jeans for Genes. I will update you on the Macmillan cake sale next week.

The children are demonstrating their diamond power in the classrooms and are growing in independence in all areas of school life. The staff are will be talking to the children more about Ruby & Emerald Power again next week and will introduce the classroom certificates for those children who demonstrate Ruby & Emerald Power.

This week Ladybirds have been learning about Pets. They have set up a Pet Shop and have been learning about coins and money as they visited the shop to purchase pets and accessories for their pets. The children have enjoyed making their own pets from junk modelling materials and they wrote labels for their pet display in the classroom.







Woodland Class have been retelling the story of Jack & The Beanstalk, they have made up actions to verbally retell the story and this was a useful aid when they has to independently write the story. In mathematics, the children have been thinking about 'What is in a number?' They have been learning about place value and have started with teen numbers and the Year 2 children have been looking at hundreds, tens and units! In Art they have been looking at Monet's Water Lilies and enjoyed using a range of techinques with chalks and paints to recreate the picture. In History, the children joined Kestrel Class to find out about World War 1 and how it started. We will be learning about WW1 over the next few weeks and finding out about the Fallen of Ibstone.

Kestrel Class have been writing Kennings about a teacher and then about something of their own choice such as a cat, mouse or winter. They have also been learning about prepositions! In mathematics, they have been drawing 2D shapes accurately and finding our about different types of triangles. The whole class worked together to learn how to use the protractor on the interactive panel and measured angles in triangles!

Water Bottles


All children need to bring a water bottle to school everyday. Please make sure you send in a named bottle.
