Dear Families,

Cross country running club enjoyed exploring a different route this week and everyone was incredibly impressed with their stamina coming back up 'the hill!' Well done everyone!









What have we been learning this week...

Ladybirds have been retelling the story of Goldilocks through roleplay. They have written cards to Baby Bear to say sorry for breaking his chair! They thought it would be kind to make him a new chair, so they have worked in small groups to plan and make a new chair for Baby Bear. They have also retold the story of The Gingerbread Man and have been measuring and weighing the ingredients to make their own gingerbread people. In mathematics they have been using positional language to describe the positions of the characters in the stories.









Woodland Class have been drawn their own text maps for their own version of Traction Man. They have edited their work and have been learning how to include speech marks to denote speech in their stories. In mathematics they have been learning about position and direction, they have used directional language to guide their friend on a trail in the playground. They have also enjoyed using Beebots (floor robots) and the BeeBot App on the iPads to program to develop their positional and directional language skills. In science they have been following rules to make a bridge for Traction Man and Barbie! The children have also been designing their Traction Man vehicles, they have been working really hard to follow their designs during their initial making.









Kestrel Class have been working on using verbs and adverbs this week. They have also written their own adventure stories with some finding moon rock on new planets and others finding lost pets in deep dark forests. In mathematics they have been comparing measurements (after converting them) and have been adding and subtracting different lengths. In science they have been learning about states of matter and have found out about the behvaviour of particles in solids, liquids and gases.







Osprey Class have continued reading 'Floodland', they have written a diary entry from the perspective of Zoe, the main character, showing her thoughts, concerns and feelings at a key part of the story. They have also stopped at various "cliff hangers" and made predictions based on evidence in the text as to what will happen next. In mathematics they have continued their work on fractions. They have been ordering fractions with different denominators and adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators both within 1 and using mixed numbers to answer when greater than 1. In science they have been using prisms to look at how light is refracted, including looking at the visible spectrum when light is refracted through a triangular prism. In history they have been finding out about Operation Sealion and how it changed the outcome of the war.
