#### **Distance Learning**

Well, its been an odd few weeks with everyone having to adjust to a new 'normal' that doesn't quite feel normal! Thank you all for jumping onboard with Google Classroom and our distance learning offering. Your feedback to the surveys I sent out has been very valuable and I have passed on the feedback to the teachers, it was reassuring that over 95% of those who responded felt we were providing the right amount of work. For those of you who felt your child needed more, please look at the other activities that have been set in the Whole School & Forest School Classrooms.

It was so lovely to see so many of the children during our Zoom sessions yesterday, we were all excited to be back together, even for just a short time. I will be sending out the Zoom timetable over the holidays so that we can keep in touch with the children and I know that the teachers are enjoying planning their sessions for the children. There will be a regular slot at 6pm on a Tuesday and Thursday for story time with me. Ladybirds, Woodland Class and any younger siblings are welcome to join me on a Tuesday, these will be short picture book stories. Children in Kestrel Class and Osprey Class are welcome to join me on a Thursday at 6pm for a chapter or two of 'Dragons at Crumbling Castle'.

Thank you for taking the time to help your child upload their distance learning, we have all been amazed and very impressed with the work that has been completed at home. We have loved receiving messages from the children and have been impressed with the way they are using Google Classroom to ask questions, develop their knowledge and understanding and keep in touch with their teachers.

### What have we been learning this week...

Ladybirds have been enjoying Easter themed learning this week and have been predicting who will help the Easter Bunny save Easter. They have also been writing about where the Easter Bunny might go on holiday (obviously after we are allowed out of lockdown!). In mathematics they have been practising their number formation by writing numbers on paper eggs ready for an egg hunt in their house/garden. They have also been solving some Easter word

problems.

Woodland Class have continued their Ocean topic by planning and writing non chrnological reports about their chosen sea creature, they have also made models, painted or drawn pictures of their sea creature in its habitat. In mathematics thay have been counting in groups and using arrays for multiplying. They have also been set an Easter Egg Hunt challenge using their times table knowledge.



Kestrel Class have been learning about verbs, adverbs and prefixes and have produced some wonderful work! In mathematics they have been finding fractions of amounts and have moved on to adding fractions.







Osprey Class have been enjoying discussing their class reader 'Phoenix', they have been answering questions about each chapter and have written a character profile for Bixa. In mathematics they have had a quick recap of lots of concepts they had been learning about in school from fractions, decimals, place value to multiplication and division (all in one week!). The children have also continued finding out about seed dispersal in science and have prooduced some amazing work!
