There was a good turn out for Pilates too and Mrs Hunt is going to run a weekly session on a Friday afternoon at 1.30pm. The email invite will go out to all families and will be sent to the

oldest child in each family. This should arrive at 11.30am on a Friday morning.



What have we been learning this week...

Ladybirds have been listening to the story of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt', they have been retelling the story, acting it out in person and with toys and they have been going on their own bear hunt using a story map. In mathematics, they have been looking at number bonds and the different ways they can make numbers.











Woodland Class have enjoyed learning the story map for The Enormous Turnip, we have enjoyed seeing the videos and photos of the children acting the story out! They have also written recipes for soup and have had a go at making their own vegetable soup. In mathematics they have been tackling revision challenges and have had to recall lots of their prior learning to help them.







The children have also been designing their dream garden, planting seeds, looking at plants and drawing and labelling the parts of a flowering plant!










Kestrel Class have started looking at 'Beware of the Iron Man', they have looked at the vocabulary used in the text and have learnt the text map on Zoom! They are focussing on the description of the Iron Man and we are all looking forward to seeing their drawings of the Iron Man later on! In mathematics they have continued their work on fractions and have been recording tenths as decimals!







Kestrel Class have also been designing and making boats, thank you for the videos of their maiden voyages!

Osprey Class have enjoyed being able to continue to read their class book "Phoenix" in their morning Zoom meetings! Mrs Hartigan has really enjoyed hearing the children read sections of the story to each other. They have used the book as a stimulus for non fiction writing. First they wrote instructions - how to turn a human into an Axxa. They are now working on an information text all about an astrolabe. In maths the children have used the White Rose website and have learnt all about adding and subtracting decimals. The children have also been looking at their family tree and as an extra challenge have been asked to write about their family members in French!


