I am pleased to report that the four tadpoles released into our pond are still happily swimming about, they are quite hard to photograph but I managed to snap one. What have we been learning this week...

Ladybirds have been adapting the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt', instead they have been on a Polar Bear Hunt and have drawn their own story maps, addding their own words such as 'crumble, crack' to describe the sounds they heard as they crept across the ice. In mathematics, they have been making patterns with sounds, objects and natural materials



Woodland Class have been innovating their Enormous Turnip stories and have spent time acting them out, there are some interesting titles out there and we can't wait to read the final stories in the next few weeks. In mathematics, they have been revisiting the concepts they have been learning this year. They have continued to think about planting and growing and have been set a sunflower challenge to investigate the environments plants will grow in. The children enjoyed their transpiration experiment, although we found out that it doesn't work that well with spring onions!



Kestrel Class have continued to look at 'Beware of the Iron Man'. They have created a comic strip of the story and have discussed the parts they liked and disliked during their Zoom sessions. They have also written questions they would like to ask the characters in the story, it was lovely to hear them sharing these in their Zoom session too. In mathematics, they have been solving problems and have revised column addition and subtraction.

In DT the children were asked to design Iron Man, some of the class have made some amazing models using recycled materials.




The whole of KS2 have looked at the painting 'Mona Lisa' and have created their own portrait in the same style.







They have been using the text to investigate how the author uses semi-colons to punctuate sections of the story. They have also been developing their note taking skills but making notes about the key events in each chapter. The children have enjoyed describing a nebula and have drafted some amazing work.





In mathematics they have continued to learn about adding and subtracting decimals and have been working with numbers using 1, 2 and 3 decimal places.

Osprey Class have also been learning about the life cycles of mammals, which was particulary apt for one family who discovered one of their guinea pigs had given birth this week!









In geography they have researched sustainability and have made presentations about how we can live more sustainably, including information about recycling and renewable energy sources.
