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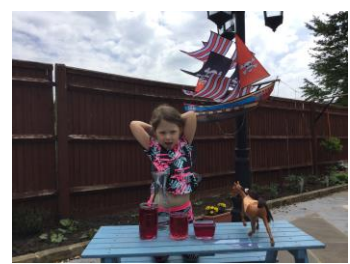

It has been another busy week in school and at home, the children are continuing to wow us all with their distance learning efforts! Well done!

What have we been learning this week...

Ladybirds have continued on their Pirate Adventure, they have been learning songs, making treasure maps, drawing and labelling treasure and hiding their treasure boxes! In mathematics they have been finding out about capacity and have used mathematical vocabulary such as full, half full and empty. They were also set the challenge of finding out which cup would hold the most drink for the thirsty pirates.



The children enjoyed making their own pirate ship and explored floating and sinking, they had to estimate how many marbles it would take to sink their ship.

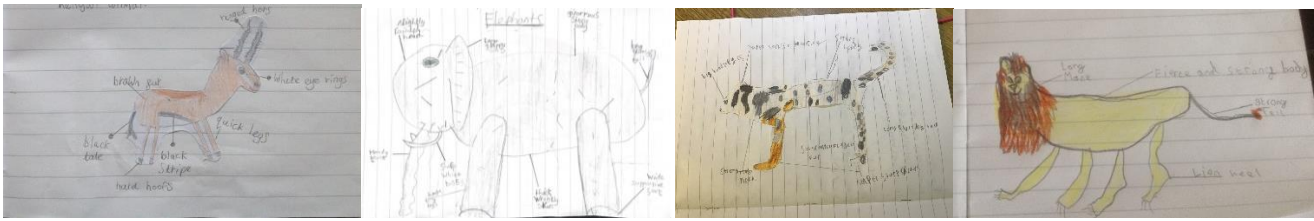
In Woodland Class, the children have continued to pursue their African adventures in their two groups. The Lions Group have been using time conjunctions to write their news. They have also listened to 'Handa's Surprise' and have sequenced the story and acted it out. In mathematics, they have been using a variety of methods to add three numbers together. The children have also chosen an African flag to research, they were challenged to make their own flags and write about what the colours and symbols represent.

Safari Group have researched animals that would live in the Kenyan savannah and have written some amazing fact files about them. They have also drawn and labelled their animals, including some excellent describing words.



In mathematics, they have continued counting animals on their safari and have produced some amazing tally charts, pictograms and graphs. Everyone enjoyed playing African instrument bingo and there have been some superb African savannah collages.

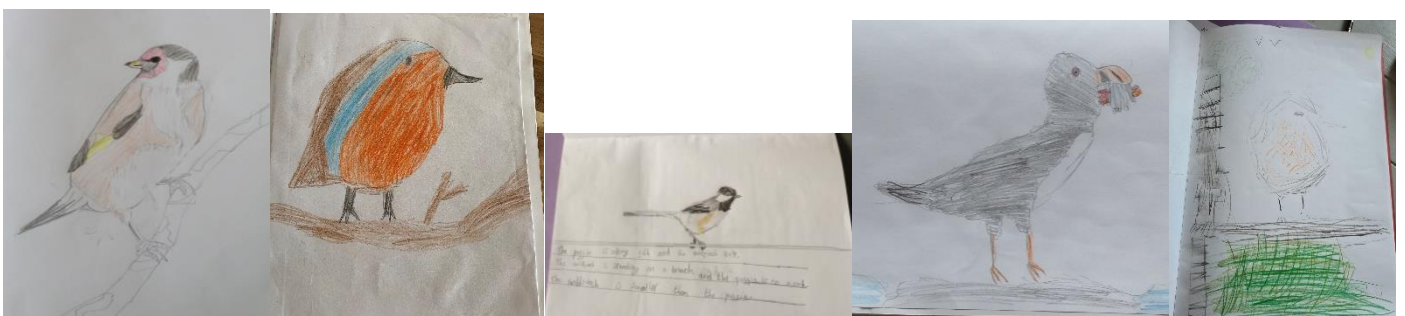


Kestrel Class have been investigating how they can use adverbs to add extra information about verbs. They have also used the non fiction boxing up model to plan out their reports about trolls. They have all enjoyed thinking of interesting facts to share about their trolls, I will look forward to sharing some of these with you next week. In mathematics, they have been learning how to use the expanded multiplication written method to multiply 2 and 3 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers.

The whole of Key Stage 2 have been researching historical figures and have written facts about them.



In art, they have moved on from drawing feathers to drawing a variety of different birds.

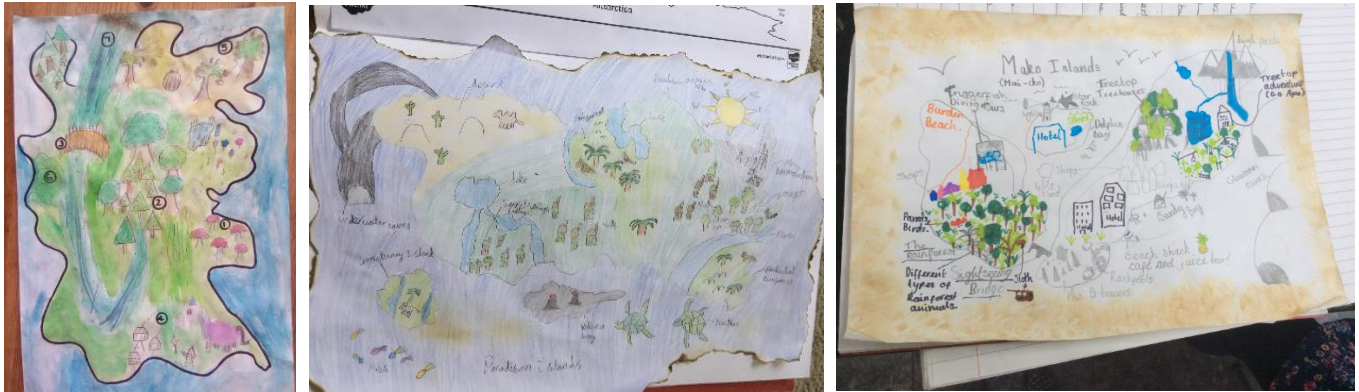


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Osprey Class have continued to read 'When the Whales Came'. They have been learning about relative pronouns and relative causes and have written sentences containing these. They have continued to write their own story – The Cursed Island. In mathematics, they have continued to learn about translating shapes and coordinates. They have also started learning about measurement and have concentrated on converting between different units of measurements such as between millilitres and litres as well as solving problems involving measurements.

In their Anywhere Island project, they have created a map of the island, described the island when they arrived and created a national identity which included a flag and national anthem.
