Dear Families,

It has been lovely to touch base with the majority of the children this week via their Zoom sessions, I know from feedback from the children and staff that these are working well. A huge thank you to the staff for planning such great sessions and thank you to you all for ensuring your children are there, ready to learn!

What have we been learning this week...

Ladybirds have continued on their Pirate Adventure, they have listened to pirate stories and have predicted what might happen in the story. They have made wanted posters to help catch the naughty pirate, they had to think carefully about what they included in their description. They have enjoyed finding out facts and myths about pirates.





In mathematics they have been doubling, they were challenged to find objects in the garden and double them, they have doubled ladybird spots and duplo bricks. They have even used mirrors to explore doubling!







In Woodland Class, The Lions Group have been retelling 'Handa's Surprise', they have been unjumbling sentences to find out who stole the fruit from Handa's basket. They have also been writing their own sentences using adjectives. In mathematics they have been subtracting 10 and multiples of 10 and enjoyed playing 'Subtract the Pig'. The children have also been learning a song to accompany Handa's Surprise and they have been challenged to compose their own version of the song. I shall look forward to hearing these compositions!





Safari Group have been thinking about adjectives and similes this week and have written some amazing spine poems. A spine poem is where you look at a photograph and list the key features you can see, then you set about describing them, forming a poem around the key features (which act like a spine). I will share the children's work next week, but for now, here is our class brainstorm and first few lines of our draft spine poem about a Hippopotamus.



The yawning hippopotamus is sunbathing in the murky river, His terrifying teeth sparkle in the midday sun, shining as bright orange as the sunset.

Small black beady eyes, staring at the sky,

His long wiry thin whiskers are tickling his nose, Huge flaring nostrils sniff the air

In mathematics, the children have been solving one step and two step word problems, they have become teachers and have written their own word problems for their peers to answer!

The children enjoyed making their own djembe drums. There were some excellent performances!





Kestrel Class have been writing their reports about trolls and have included information about the caves they live in, what troll school is like, what jobs they do, their hobbies and their favourite holiday destinations!

In mathematics, they have been learning how to divide 2 and 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number using the short division method.

There was some breaking news at the beginning of the week when Professor Folklore reported that a new island had been discovered and that its only inhabitants were trolls! The children have designed maps, flags and composed a national anthem for the new island!




Osprey Class have continued to wow Mrs Hartigan with their commitment to learning and the high standard of work they have been submitting. Well done, we are all very proud of you!

This week, they have used their class book to explore more complex vocabulary. They have written a detailed description of being lost in the fog based on a section in the book where the main characters are lost in the fog. They have moved on to writing a persuasive article about Bryer as a holiday destination.

In mathematics, they have continued to convert different units of measurement such as grams to kilograms and litres to millilitres. They have also studied units of measurement for time and have used timetables to solve problems. They were challenged to plan a family journey from Ibstone to the Scilly Isles. They had to decide which method of transport they would use to get to the islands, how much it would cost and the time they would need to leave Ibstone to ensure they were in time to catch the ferry or plane!

As part of their Anywhere Island Project, they have created rules for the citizens of their islands and made a discovery of a new life form on the island!
