Dear Families,

Welcome back! I hope you all had a wonderful half term break. The children have all come back to school refreshed and ready to learn.

It has been a week of firsts in the history of Ibstone CE Primary School this week. Firstly, we have welcomed a team of volunteers from Barclays, Westwood Park who kindly came to help us in the school grounds. Their MAD day certainly has Made A Difference! A huge thank you to Jo and the rest of the team for all their hard work!

On Thursday lunchtime our first cross country running club set out for their inaugral run, a huge thank you to Claire Randall for heading up the club and for making it happen! A huge thank you to Mrs Hartigan and Mrs Statham for heading out with the runners too! Mrs Hartigan was very impressed with every single runner! She thinks we already have a very competitive team!









Thursday lunchtime also saw the first Ukulele Band practice, everyone enjoyed their first session and we are all looking forward to hearing their progress over the next few weeks.



What have we been learning this week...

The Ladybirds have been retelling the story of 'Rosie's Walk', they have enjoyed retelling the story by going for a walk, using actions and using small world objects. The have made masks and used them in their retelling too! In mathematics they have been looking at numbers and thought about how many different ways they could make 5,6,7,8,9 and 10.

Woodland Class have been learning about Guy Fawkes and the Gun Powder Plot, they have made 'WANTED' posters and written newspaper reports about the event! They have enjoyed discussing the fireworks they have seen and the sounds they could hear when the fireworks went off. In mathematics, they have been exploring 2D and 3D shape, they have been using mathematical vocabulary such as faces, edges and vertices. The children have also continued their 'People who Help Us' topic and have been finding out about Florence Nightingale. I wonder if they can tell you what she did?

Kestrel Class have been using inverted commas to denote speech in their writing, they have looked at the story of 'The Canal' and have started to learn it using a Talk for Writing text map. In mathematics they have been multiplying and dividing by 8, they have been using arrays and have applied these skills to solve word problems. In computing, the children have been working together to look at Scratch, a computer coding program. They have all enjoyed practising their coding skills and are beginning to make simple programs.

Osprey Class have started to read their class text 'Fireweed', they have used this text to help develop their background knowledge of World War 2. They have been investigating characters' feelings and making predictions about what might happen in the story. In mathematics, they have been learning about imperial and metric units of measure and have learnt to use graphs to make approximate conversions. They have also looked at line graphs and have learnt how to draw them and how to interpret them. In science, they have been learning about reversible and irreversible changes and made a new material (casein plastic) from the chemical reaction between milk and vinegar. In geography they have been finding out about earthquakes and how and why they happen, they also investigated how buildings are constructed to decrease destruction in earthquake areas.

Forest School

Year 3 have been looking at the sizes of pieces of wood used to make a successful fire. This week a fire was needed so that everyone could make toffee apple slices over the fire, several of the children showed amazing perseverance when using the fire stick to light the cotton wool. Well done!

Year 4 linked their session to the Romans and made mosaic patterns with the fallen leaves. They also tried their hand at den building before enjoying toffee apple slices over the fire.

The Ladybirds enjoyed looking at the fallen leaves and played games with them using the parachute. They also made good use of the Year 4 dens too!
