Dear Families,

Welcome to the new term at Ibstone CE Primary School! A particularly warm welcome to all our new children, families and staff, it is great to welcome you to our expanding family!

Thank you to you all for sending your children into school looking so smart and ready to learn. The Year 3 children in particular looked so smart in their ties on the first day.

As always, this will be a bumper newsletter as there is so much to share with you at this point in the year, so please keep reading...

Rolling Drop Off

This will start on Monday morning and is for families in Woodland Class and Kestrel Class only, if you wish to use it. Ladybirds parents will need to bring their children on to the playground and wait with them until the bell goes. The drop off zone will be marked out by a large banner on the fence at the front of the school. We will initially cone off the area to show the no parking zone. Please make sure that your child is sitting on the correct side for drop off as this will make it run more smoothly. Thank you for your support.

Parking

With the increased number of cars at the school and the permanent introduction of the rolling drop off, it would help from a safety perspective if more parents would park on the road heading down towards the church during peak times such as drop off and pick up.

School Times

Thank you to all those parents who are already arriving and collecting on time, it really helps make the day run smoothly for the children and staff. In case there has been any confusion, the rolling drop off and playground are open from 8.40am each morning. The bell rings at 8.50am and learning starts straight away. Please make sure your child is here on time so as not to impact on their learning. The end of day times are 3.15pm for Ladybirds and Woodland Class. Kestrel Class finish at 3.25pm. We understand that sometimes on the odd occasion you may be running a little late, please let us know via the office if this is the case. We have already had a number of late collections in the first three days. As of Monday, if we have not heard from you we will hold your child for 5 minutes after their pick up time, after which they will be sent to Kites and you will be charged £5.50 per child. The staff often have meetings at the end of the working day and cannot be waiting on the playground.

Contact Books

Hopefully you have all received your child's purple Contact Book, please make sure that you have filled in the white form at the front of these books and please send them into school every day. If you have sent in a message, please put the yellow tab up so we know we need to read your message. The aim of this book is to improve communication, a member of staff will be on the playground every morning and will be happy to speak to you, however this book will ensure that all staff working with the children have the information they need.

Individual Photographs

Our fantastic school photographer Danny Higgins is coming to school on Tuesday 19th September. He will be taking individual and sibling photos during the morning, please email the office by Friday 15th September if you have non- school siblings you would like to bring in for an early morning photo shoot.

PE Kits, Wellies, Water Bottles and Coats

PE Kit - PE lessons will start next week, please make sure your child's PE Kit is in school on Monday. I have had a few people asking about plimsolls and trainers. As a school we are more than happy for your child to have plimsolls or trainers (it doesn't matter what colour as long as they fit and your child can put them on by themselves).

Wellies – all children need a pair of wellies in school at all times. Please make sure these are named, some parents also provide a peg to keep the wellies together.

Water Bottles – please make sure your child has their named water bottle in school at all times. I would like to remind parents that we do not allow squash or carbonated drinks in the children's water bottles. As a school we understand the importance of encouraging children to drink water throughout the day and as a result, children are allowed to bring in water bottles with fresh fruit (such as slices of orange/lemon/lime) in their water bottle.

Coats – as you can never predict the weather here in Ibstone, please ensure your child has a waterproof coat with a hood in school everyday. We pride ourselves on being a school that goes out whatever the weather!

Phew... we got there... I hope you are still with me and managed to absorb some of the information.

In other news

Our eleven new Ladybirds have enjoyed their first two mornings in school and have enjoyed exploring their classroom and the school grounds. They have each made their own ladybird for the classroom door to welcome visitors.
