Welcome to our Christmas newsletter which will include last week's news and take us to the end of term.

Our thanks to them both for keeping us informed and also our thanks to ben Randall for clearing and gritting pathways around the school for access.

Last week, we had no internet so could not send out the newsletter, so our news is now conveyed to you in chronological order.

A huge thank you to Bex as Chair and to all the PTA and to you all for your tremendous support for the Christmas Fayre. The children had fun leading up to the Fayre, making a variety of crafts which parents very generously purchased on the day. The Christmas Fayre was a great success, so thank you all for your contributions and support and for spending money on the day.

The PTA are committed to spending half the money raised on the children currently in school and to putting the rest towards fundraising for equipment and resources that will be required in the new building project. To this end, the PTA has asked staff to supply their wish lists. Each class has been allocated £250 to spend on resources of their choice with a further £250 made available to Kestrel class to purchase new books.

We hope you have all enjoyed The Nativity this year. Thank you for your help with costumes and costume preparation. We are incredibly proud of all the children. They have rehearsed in a purposeful way, conveying the true dignity of the story of the birth of Jesus. The children have really enjoyed learning and singing the songs which are very catchy and sing-a-long. We walked down to church to rehearse in situ and for the dress rehearsal wearing our smart new Hi-Viz waistcoats.

The Ladybirds have been learning all sorts of fascinating facts about penguins this week. They have practised their cutting skills cutting around the outline of a penguin too. The children have also been making angels. In maths the children have been looking at repeating patterns. They transferred this skill by making repeating patterns on a Snowman's scarf.

The children have been reading the story of The Magic of Christmas. The story gave the children the opportunity to imagine and predict what the mice would find next. The children have also been writing about what they would like to find under their Christmas tree.

In the Woodland class the children have been treated to a 3D shape magic show! The children have been practising describing the properties of 3D shapes: describing the faces, vertices and edges. The children have made some 3D models including zoos, gardens, castles, stables, space centres and rockets.



In science the children have learned about snowflakes and how snowflakes are formed. The children have written their own poems about snowflakes trying to use rhyming words. This week the children have also been learning about animals and their habitats. In music, the children composed a class Christmas rap.

In Kestrel class, the children have continued their work with poems this week. The children have been reading a range of poems, including looking at shape poems. The children have practised reading poetry aloud to consider the audience. The children have been discussing ideas and critiquing poems. In maths the children have been practising co-ordinates, paying attention to read across the x axis, then up the y axis. Christmas flair was brought into the co-ordinates learning as the children discovered Christmassy items as they plotted their co-ordinates and then connected the dots. The children were challenged to create their own designs and record the co-ordinates.



In geography, co-ordinates have also been used. The children have been locating countries in Europe as well as finding rivers and mountains in Great Britain. The children were challenged to set co-ordinate challenges for one another. The children in Kestrel class also created the designs for the Nativity programmes.
