The children were also challenged to be like the wise man who built his house upon the rocks. We have really enjoyed seeing what the children have been building.















What we have been learning this week....

Ladybirds have listened to the story of Little Red Riding Hood, they have written shopping lists, made wanted posters and have pretended to be the wolf writing a letter to Grandma to say sorry! In mathematics that have been exploring containers as part of their capacity work. They have also been learning about subtraction and have been using a number line to help them record their work.







Woodland Class have continued to look at the story 'Beegu', they have been learning how to use adjectives in a sentence of three. They have also written a short character description about Beegu using an exciting range of adjectives and similes.

In mathematics, Group 1 have been learning about subtraction within 10 and moving on to 20. They have used a range of methods including tens frames, number tracks and number lines to solve number sentences and have started looking at word problems. In Group 2, the children have practised their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. They have practised recalling their times tables and have looked at representing multiplication facts in different ways. Group 2 have also started learning about division by recapping how to share objects into equal groups.

In history, the children have been exploring what the life of an astronaut is like and have made some posters about 'life in space'. In art they have looked at Van Gogh's 'Starry Night', this week they have been experimenting with different media to create the sky section of the picture. I am looking forward to sharing some more their pictures with you next week!









Kestrel Class have been looking at the importance of trees in our local environment this week and have been writing persuasive letters and posters to encourage people to look after trees and stop deforestation.

Group 3 have used their story plans to write their own version of 'Jack & the Baked Beanstalk', they have wowed Miss Firth with their original ideas and fantastic stories. Well done!

In mathematics, Year 3 & 4 have been looking at using the part whole model to divide 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers. They have moved onto using repeated subtraction on a number line in order to divide 2 digit numbers where there is a remainder. Year 4 have moved onto looking at the short division method.


After researching British endangered species lask week, the children have created some excellent leaflets about their chosen animal, explaining why they have become endangered and identifying areas where they can still be found in the UK.






In RE, Kestrel Class have been recapping their understanding of The Holy Trinity, they have also looked at The Ten Commandments and have created a poster to help explain the meaning of each one.





Osprey Class have continued to read 'Cogheart'. Year 5 have been taking on the role of Lily and have been writing diary entries with an emphasis on her thoughts and feelings. Year 6 have been reporters and have been interviewing various witnesses. Using their interview findings they have then produced a newspaper article about the airship accident.

involved." The local mechanics have confirmed that the Dragonfly was in good condition and regularly serviced, the last one taking place one month ago.




