Dear Families,

Welcome back to the last half term of the school year! There are lots of activities planned for this term and we have already hit the ground running!

It always makes me feel so proud of our wonderful school community when I see the children skipping in to see their friends each day and the amazing smiles and good mornings the staff receive from parents and children alike.

This week we welcomed Reverend Philip and his wife Lucy to school, they, along with Reverend Mark, joined us for Worship on a Walk this week. The children are getting used to our new route and the pace was slightly quicker than before half term. During our Worship on a Walk we listened to the various bird song we could hear in the woods, looked for nests and discovered why an egg reminds me of The Holy Trinity! The children will be finding out more about the Holy Trinity over the next few weeks with Reverend Mark and Reverend Philip.

A huge thank you to Mollie in Woodland Class who has been on a fundraising mission! She took it upon herself to write a letter asking for donations towards our Library Fundraiser. The reciprient was so impressed with her letter that we have just received a donation of £2000! Thank you Mollie!

To date, we have now raised £3144.13!

We have also been informed that we are receiving a donation of £200 from Ibstone Cricket Club this week! Thank you to the committee for supporting the school!



What we have been learning this week...

Ladybirds have started their topic about 'Minibeasts'. They have been thinking about their favourite minibeast and have worked together to make a class book about minibeasts.

In mathematics, they have focused on spatial awareness and have looked at shapes. The children have been cutting rectangles to make two triangles and used squares to make the biggest 3 and 4 sided shapes. They have also used their spatial awareness to manipulate shapes to make tangram pictures.

Their minibeast hunt in the garden was very successful and the children found a wide range of minibeasts hiding in the garden!



Woodland Class have enjoyed reading and learning the story of St George and the Dragon. They have been retelling the story using actions and have been finding definitions of unfamiliar words from the text.


In mathematics, Group 1 have continued their work on fractions. The children have been learning how to find half of an amount using practical resources and have also started learning about quarters. Group 2 have finished their work on position and direction and have been learning how to write instructions using positional language to direct Lego figures through a maze. They have also been making repeated patterns using 2D shapes and turns.


In science, the children have been learning about the basic needs of humans and animals. They were asked to imagine that they were stranded on a desert island and had to think about which items they needed to survive. The children then used their ideas to think about animals and discussed whether or not animals have the same needs as humans.

In history, the children have been learning about castles. They thoroughly enjoyed researching facts about castles using a range of non-fiction books and the iPads. The children then used the information they found to create a fact file.

Kestrel Class have become inventors this week! They have watched some 'Wallace and Gromit's Cracking Contraptions' and have used these as inspiration to create their own inventions. The children have deisgned some fantastic machines to help around the house!







After designing their inventions, they looked at a range of persuasive adverts and identified the key features, they found that using rhetorical questions to start their writing was a great way to hook the reader in and encourage them to read on and find out more about the product. The children are planning and writing their own persuasive adverts for their inventions to appeal to potential buyers!

In mathematics, everyone has started a unit of work on time. Year 3 and 4 have started looking at o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to and have moved on to telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes on analogue clocks. Group 3 have been looking at sequencing activities and have been using the vocabulary 'before' and 'after'. They have also been learning about dates and how to use calendars.

In science they are learning about the digestive system and have been looking at the role of the digestive system and the different parts of the body that are in this system.

Osprey Class have had an assessment week this week and have been revisiting their learning to date. We have all been very impressed with their perseverance and courage, our Ibstone Values have shone through

In RE, the children have been learning about Sikhism, they have been finding out about the Guru Granth Sahib, Langar, the Gurdwara and the five K's. They will be using this knowledge and their prior knowledge about Christianity to explore 'What is best for our world? Does religion help people decide?'
